- We will provide support in constructively tackling any form of harassment or intimidation.
- We will raise awareness of equality, diversity and inclusion issues.
- We will offer training to staff and trustees.
- We will encourage our contractors, advisers and other partners to respect our policy.
- We require all our learners to comply with our Learner Charter.
- If any user has a specific access or other requirement, we will make every effort to accommodate it. We will respond positively to any requests for improving access and make reasonable adjustments where possible.
